

## Monsignor Vincent (Vince) John Redden 1937 - 2024

Mons Vince was born in Purlewaugh, near Coonabarabran on 8 December 1937. His schooling included in Sydney at Sacred Heart Primary Mosman, St Aloysius College Milson's Point and St Ignatius College, Riverview. From school he entered the seminary of St Columba's Springwood in 1955, moving to St Patrick's Manly. He was ordained to the priesthood on 15 July 1961 at St Mary's Cathedral by Cardinal Gilroy.

He served as assistant Priest at the Parishes of Haberfield, Redfern, Balgowlah, Camperdown, Seven Hills, and Merryland. He was Parish Priest at Ryde and was at Drummoyne for over 17 years.

He has also served as a chaplain in the Army Reserve for 25 years, been Dean of St Mary's Cathedral, acted as the Archbishop's Vicar for Clergy in the Sydney Archdiocese for 12 years, served as Chairman of the Sydney Archdiocese Catholic Schools Board for four years.

Mons Redden was also instrumental in the building upgrades at St Mark's Primary and within the Church grounds.

Mons Vince died on 9 October 2024. He was 86 years of age. May he rest in peace.


