- Personal Symbols of Faith are placed on the coffin.



THE FINAL COMMENDATION

After the priest says the Prayer after Communion those appointed come forward and remove the symbols, flowers and the pall. The person taking the flowers holds them and when everything is removed she puts the flowers back onto the coffin.

The Abbess proceeds to the head of the coffin and the community move down in their stalls so as to be ready for the singing of the "Non Nobis" and then the procession from the church during the "In Paradisum".

The priest stands near the coffin for the Rite of Burial and Final Commendation.

Let us pray with confidence to God, who gives life to all things, that he will raise up this mortal body to the perfection and company of the saints.


Guiding the coffin from the church. 4 of the sisters move to take their positions beside the coffin. They remain there until the end of the singing of the "Non Nobis Domine".




In Paradisum

When all are assembled at the cemetery the priest says the following.








Sr Elizabeth knew how to enjoy life and "kick off her shoes"!














Elizabeth's lamp, her life, shone in our community like a bright star lighting the way for us. With radiance and clarity of vision it beamed forth.
